INSTRUCTIONS AND SCHEDULE FOR CHAMPIONSHIP SECTION BANDS – YEAR 2024

The Yorkshire Brass Band Championships, CHAMPIONSHIP SECTION, will be held at Huddersfield Town Hall, Ramsden Street, Huddersfield HD1 2TA on SUNDAY 3rd MARCH 2024. This information should be communicated to every member of your band and officials.

Section ONE Contest 8.00 a.m. 09:30 a.m.

CHAMPIONSHIP Section Contest 12.45 am 3:00p.m.

Sections Two, Four and Three will take place on Saturday 2nd March 2024.

Refreshments will be available from the Old Court Room Bar, Stalls entrance, Corporation Street.

Trade Stands will also be situated in the Corporation Street entrance to the Stalls level and Old Court Room Bar.

DRAW - ON ARRIVAL DELEGATES WILL BE DIRECTED TO THE COUNCIL CHAMBER

Delegates for ALL sections should enter the building by the Ramsden Street Door (Band member's entrance).

The draw will take place in the Council Chamber on 1st Floor – access via stairs or lift.

Only **one** draw delegate ticket per band will be issued. <u>Only the appointed band representative will be admitted</u> and the delegate ticket must be presented.

At the draw a timetable will be distributed stating times when bands will be allowed into the dressing room/warm-up/registration areas. PERCUSSION/BAND LAYOUT PLAN SHEETS; FIRE REGULATIONS PERSONNEL SHEETS and YOUNGEST PLAYER NOMINATION SHEET, circulated to all bands, will be collected at the draw.

Completion of the TWO Fire Regulation Registers and identification of children aged 16 years and under is a mandatory requirement of Kirklees Council.

BAND MEMBER TICKETS – Championship Section

The lower seating capacity at Huddersfield has resulted in a restriction on the number of band member tickets that can be issued to the Championship Section Bands

Fifteen (15) tickets will be issued to each Championship Section band. These will be issued to your delegate at the draw.

The fifteen issued tickets <u>must be handed in by your Contest Secretary at registration</u> and will be returned after the band's performance.

Band Member tickets will only allow access to the Gallery (entry via Princess Street).

Any further tickets required will have to be purchased from the Box Office. Tickets go on sale on Monday, 15th January. Band members, in uniform, without a ticket will be allowed into the hall for the results ceremony, if seats are available.

PARENT AND CHAPERONE TICKETS

Parent and chaperone tickets (as required) will be issued to the band secretary at the **DRAW**.

ENTRANCE FOR PLAYING MEMBERS AND OFFICIALS - ENTER VIA RAMSDEN STREET ENTRANCE.

To comply with Council Fire Regulations only band personnel/officials who are entered on the personnel sheets will be allowed into the building. Please ensure your band enter the building 'en-bloc'. TIMINGS MUST BE STRICTLY ADHERED. YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ACCESS TO THE BUILDING BEFORE YOUR ALLOCATED TIME. To help alleviate bands waiting around outside in the cold you can check if the contest is running to time by

contacting the Dressing Room Steward on 07738 639633 and we will also be giving regular updates on twitter/x@yrbbc. Wheelchair users should use the Corporation Street Entrance. Steward will direct them to the dressing room area. Once in the venue a lift is available to backstage areas and for stage entrance. Please advise the contest controller at your draw if you have players who require assistance throughout their time in the building.

COACHES AND CAR PARKING - HUDDERSFIELD

Coaches should approach by Alfred Street **NOT High Street** as you will be liable for £60 fine. Coaches must adhere to all parking regulations around the Town Hall area. Coaches must make their own arrangements regarding coach parking. There are a number of Council managed car parks in walking distance of the Town Hall.

DRESSING ROOM AREA

On entering the building the band will be allocated a dressing room space by the stewards. We request that band members remain in the allocated dressing room during this period and NOT stand in the corridor areas. CORRIDORS MUST BE KEPT CLEAR AT ALL TIMES TO COMPLY WITH TOWN HALL SAFETY.

Please Note: The Contest and Hall Management do not accept any responsibility for any loss and/or damage to any instruments, valuables or clothing whilst in the building.

YOUNG PLAYERS (16 AND UNDER) DRESSING ROOM AREA "Ouite Room and Sensory Room"

If any senior players intend changing in the dressing room area then young players MUST use the allocated male/female young players dressing rooms. A steward will direct them to this area (2nd floor facilities) Please bring this to the attention of your members. Chaperones must remain with the "Young" Players throughout this time.

WARM UP ROOM -

Each band will be allocated approximately 10/15 minutes in the Ceremony Room to warm up before going to registration. To prevent delays to the contest please be ready when called to warm up and please vacate and proceed to registration, without delay, on request. Children 16 and under and their chaperones will be brought to the warm up room by a steward as required.

REGISTRATION

Registration will take place in the Reception Room (First floor). Band's must be ready to move to Registration when called by the Duty Steward. On completion of Registration the band will be directed by a STEWARD whether to remain in the Reception Room or move into the BACK-STAGE "CRUSH ROOM" AREA. THIS AREA MAY BE ALLOCATED FOR THE USE OF PERCUSSIONISTS ONLY FOR 2024. A Steward will advise the band on this matter at the time.

All band members must present their band members ticket with their up-to-date Registration Card. The tickets and Registration cards will be collected and returned on completion of the performance.

<u>IMPORTANT REMINDER</u>: All your players must be registered with Brass Band Players Registry at least 7 days before the Friday of the contest weekend (i.e. by Friday 23rd February for new player registrations and Friday 23rd February for transfers) as per Rule 17 in the current National Rules.

<u>Before contest weekend</u> it is important you check to ensure there are no discrepancies in the registration of your players. Any discrepancy with player registration details may result in the disqualification of your band. You are also advised to bring your latest BBP Registry print-out of your list of players with you. CHECK BAND RE-VALIDATION DATE IS IN DATE FOR THIS CONTEST.

We request that the Band Secretary must remain with their band until Registration Officials are satisfied with all members' cards.

NOTE: The Rules of the National Brass Band Championships of Great Britain are available on download.

STAGE SET UP. ENTRY TO STAGE AND SOUNDING OF INSTRUMENTS.

Prior to the full band going on stage, only your percussion players will be allowed on stage+ any disabled player to set up percussion with Ray Payne whilst the contest stage crew set out the band layout in accordance with your plan handed in at the draw.

During this short time band members in the <u>waiting area/holding area</u> will be allowed to sound their instruments prior to going on stage. Please co-operate with the stewards by not starting to blow earlier.

The full band must proceed en bloc to the stage immediately requested to do so by the stage stewards.

For H & S reasons no seats will be placed in front of, or be moved in front of, the red line across the front of the stage. On completion of the bands performance they should vacate the stage as quickly as possible, return to the Dressing Room and vacate that area as soon as possible to assist with the smooth running of the day.

PHOTOGRAPHY/MEDIA COVERAGE

Unless the Controller is notified by a band at least one week before the contest date the organisers will assume your band has no objections to photographs being taken for use by media from band and local press reporters with the resultant reports appearing in the press and on websites etc.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF RESULTS AND PRESENTATION OF AWARDS

The results and presentation of awards will follow the final band in each Section. A representative from each band in uniform/smart dress will be required on stage prior to the results being announced (Representatives failing to comply with this request will be refused access to the stage)

Your entry form to the NATIONAL FINALS WILL BE SENT TO YOU BY KAPITOL following the completion of our contest.

A Trophy Receipt Form will be in the Prize Envelope. Please complete and return in the envelope provided. Prize monies will not be awarded until this trophy receipt has been returned to the Regional Secretary, and will be paid by BACS only. PLEASE COMPLETE THE BACS FORM PROVIDED.

All trophies must be kept secure and be returned, in a condition ready for presentation, at the request of the Committee. The band holding the trophy is responsible for suitable engraving and insurance of the trophy as per the National Rules. In addition to the annual trophies a Commemorative Shield will be presented to the top three bands in each section. The Commemorative Shield will be retained by the band as a memento of the occasion.

INSTRUMENTATION

Instruments used must be in accordance with instrumentation as listed in Rules 8(a) of the National Rules.

PERCUSSION EQUIPMENT – IMPORTANT INFORMATION.

The Committee have engaged the services of Ray Payne. He has studied the score for "Variations on an Enigma" and is aware of all requirements.

ATTACHED TO THESE INSTRUCTIONS IS THE PERCUSSION EQUIPMENT REQUIRED FOR YOUR SECTION TEST PIECE, please make sure you bring this to the attention of your percussion players and MD. Please note that the TIMPS are in a SET position on the attached plan, also noting the recommendations by Ray Payne of the positioning of certain pieces of percussion. Thank you

Please make sure you COMPLETE THE STAGE PLAN with your SEATING/STANDING ARRANGEMENT and hand in at the draw.
